III. Annual Report of Rotarian Action Group Activities (required)

Russian Health Fairs have been held in 16 cities. The program is very successful and active. In September 2008, 25 Health Fair Center leaders travelled to Dubna in Western Russia for the first ever Training Seminar. When asked if they would come to another one in the future even if Rotary did not have funding for that purpose, most said they would. The second annual Training Seminar will be held the end of October 2009 in Krasnodar, near the Black Sea in southwestern Russia. The most exciting news from this front is that most of the folks involved with the Health Fair Centers say they will continue after the completion of the 3 year old 3H grant in March 2010.

Rotarians in Mexico have continued their very successful Health Fairs in the Merida area of Cancun, and in Villahermosa located in the State of Tabasco. There has been activity in Celaya.

The government of Fiji has taken over most of the health fair operations started by Suva and Denver Rotarians, but a few Rotary clubs still produce annual fairs.

We are not sure what has been going on in the Philippines, but they had some very interesting and effective health fairs a year or so ago.

Thailand has produced some health fair activity in the northern area around Chiang Mai.

In the USA, three states have active health fair operations - Colorado, Wyoming and Alaska. There are many health fairs held around the US by community groups, or corporate entities. Homer Alaska Rotarians celebrated their 25th annual Health Fair in November of 2008. The 26th is scheduled for 14 November 2009.

Health Fair Centers are being asked to honor World Health Day 7-11 April. The World Health Organization's theme is "Urbanization a challenge for public health". They plan to have 1,000 cities block off portions of their streets for health activities, and to honor 1,000 champions of health.

Plans for the 2009-2010 Rotary year are to continue to build on current successes, to expand into new countries, and to grow our membership.
